Course goals: This course is designed to develop the abilities to clear thinking, mastery of the basic principles of counting, probabilities, and be able to apply the abilities in quantitative decision makings.

Course description: This course meets General Education "Basic Skills (D)" requirement and prepares student for introductory statistics courses in various departments. It covers the language of sets, counting procedures, introductory probability, decision-making, and introductory statistics.

Required Text: Bill Owen and Fred Cutlip, *Finite Mathematics: Introductory Probability and Statistics*, Thomson Learning

Calculator: A graphing calculator is required in class and writing exams. TI-83/84 Plus graphing calculator is recommended. I will use a TI-83 Plus to work on examples and solve problems in class.

Course outlines:

- Introductory counting and probability
- More counting and probability including conditional probability, independence, Bayes' theorem
- Random variables and probability distributions
- Introductory statistics
- Games and decisions
