The internet and other texts are fair game, but your solution should, of course, not be copied verbatim.

A Word of Advice: Many of the ideas introduced and most of the techniques used to explore these ideas will be essentially new to you. At first you will be barraged with terms and definitions. You should, consequently, expect to commit an **absolute minimum of 10 hours per week** of work outside of the classroom to this course.

Grading: Grades will be determined by the following:

- Two** 100-point exams.
- A comprehensive 100-point final exam.
- The spotlight problems/”class participation”/quiz score worth, in total, 50 points. These points will be awarded based upon my perception of your effort in the class.

Note: No (this means **NO! NO! NO! NO! NO! NO! NO! NO!**) late assignments will be accepted. It is your responsibility to make any and all arrangements regarding missed class periods.

Arrangements must be made **prior** to an exam that will be missed.
