Grades

Grades will be determined based on your percentage of points received. If you receive 93% or more of the available points, you will earn an A, receiving 90% will earn you an A-, earning 87%, a B+, earning 83%, a B, earning 80%, a B-, and so forth. The different assessments used in the course will be weighted as follows:

39% **Homework:** I will assign 18 homework assignments over the quarter, each worth 15 points. Your top 13 homework scores will count for a total of 195 points. Homework is due at 3 pm on the due date (typically Tuesday or Friday) and late homework will not be graded.

39% **Exams:** There will be three in-class exams, each worth 65 points. All three exam scores will count for a total of 195 points.

22% **Final Exam:** There will be one final exam, worth 110 points.
